How Valuable is your Bible? Little story of encouragement which came through Instagram recently (SBC is now on Instagram – find it and follow to get all the content!) I did a bit of research and the story has been going round Christian circles for some time.

The following is a true story told by Bill Bright, founder of Campus Crusade for Christ.

In the 1930's, Stalin ordered a purge of all Bibles and all believers in the former Soviet Union. Millions of Bibles were confiscated and multitudes of believers were sent to the gulags. In Stavropol, Russia, this order was carried out with a vengeance.

A few years ago, CoMission ministry, which Campus Crusade for Christ sponsors, sent a team to Stavropol. When their team had difficulties getting Bibles shipped





from Moscow, someone mentioned the existence of a warehouse outside of town where these confiscated Bibles had been stored since Stalin's days. One member finally got up the courage to ask the officials if the Bibles were still there and could be removed and distributed again to the people of Stavropol. The answer was "Yes"!

The next day the team returned with a truck and several Russian people to help load the Bibles. One helper was a young man, who was a skeptical, hostile, agnostic collegian who had come only for the day's wages.

As they were loading the Bibles, a team member noticed that the young man had disappeared. Eventually, they found him in a corner of the warehouse weeping. He had slipped away hoping to quietly take a Bible. What he had found shook him to the core. Inside the first page of the Bible he had picked up was the handwritten signature of his own grandmother! Out of the many thousands of Bibles still left in the warehouse, he had stolen the one belonging to his grandmother. She had no doubt prayed for him and



for her city, and her prayers had followed him. Now this young man's life had been transformed by the very Bible that his grandmother found so dear.

The Bible itself says, "O the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments, and his ways past finding out" (Romans 11:33).

Our small groups are the first and third Wednesday of each month and are a really good place to get to know your Bible, and to get to know more people

from the church too. The leadership are looking at having more small group Bible studies - if you could host one in your home- even if you didn't feel able to lead one, please do speak to Nathan or the Deacons.

So you see, change happens for the best, like the dim, flickering light bulb. Embrace the coming changes please! Yours, in the love of Christ, *Grahame*.


On our minds and in our Prayers

Good News on the Streets!

You may have noticed some prayer points in the Sermon notes about the Street pastors, and they have been back out on the Streets on patrol. They also had prayer partners Carol and Pam bearing them up in prayer whilst they were out. I would like to pass on a snippet from the report for that Evening.

Hus writes:- While on patrol, we introduced ourselves to security staff at The Vineyard, The Red Lion, The Lounge and Sittingbourne Train Station. We received a warm welcome back. We spoke to security staff at the train station who were curious about our role. We also provided them with a SP leaflet. On leaving the church, we were approached by two young ladies outside Bunters who described their previous positive experiences with Sittingbourne Street Pastors. In addition, one of the ladies spoke about her faith whereby Nicola took the opportunity to minister and invite her to Church. She stated

that there is a tendency for young people, often under the influence of alcohol, to congregate in the area around The Light Cinema. Also mention was made of the Youth provision at SBC, which she had previous experience of. We encouraged her to tell any younger people she may know that the provision is ongoing and that all are welcome. We were also approached by two males shouting 'flip flops' in a cheerful manner. Please pray for all the contact the Street Pastor teams have and the areas of Sittingbourne where they could make the most difference.

cleverly known as A.B. C- Adults, Babies and Children!! The volunteer team set up the hall with chairs all round the edges for the Adults. The little coffee tables are set around as stations for play- 'play stations' means something else now! The cupboard at the end is packed with building bricks, play houses, jigsaws etc. and we set out a different selection each week. We also set out a simple craft activity- sometimes the parents enjoy that even more than the children!

Monday sees us looking after around 15 children between the ages of 8 months to coming up to 3 years. If everyone came

every week there would be 20+ but it tends to stick at around 15.

The ministry part is mainly to the parents and carers who come along. The conversations range far and wide- anxieties about the

children, latest holidays and celebrations and everything in between. We give out Christian books at Christmas and Easter and have an end of term party for the Three main terms.

We can always use more volunteers – some are moving away!!
